Caen Hill Locks

The 16 locks that form the steepest part of the Devizes flight at Caen Hill are not only a scheduled ancient monument, but they are also an Olympic-sized challenge every boater must do. This is a rite of passage. Caen Hill (pronounced 'cane'), is one of the longest continuous flight of locks in the country. With a total of 29 locks with a rise of 237 feet over two miles with a 1-in-44 gradient.



Atwell Motor Museum

A small, friendly museum situated in the heart of Wiltshire. The majority of our 100+ exhibits are cars from the 1920's onwards.

They also have a collection of motorcycles, mopeds and bicycles. You can also see interesting motoring memorabilia, our Jack Spittle Model Lorry Collection and a reconstructed 1930s-style garage complete with vehicles.



Lacock Abbey

Has an 800-year history. Starting as a convent in the 13th century, the abbey became a family home for the Sharington and Talbot families. In 1835, Lacock became renowned as the place where the first photographic negative was created.
